

Frequently Asked Questions

What is Celebrate a Century?

Celebrate a Century is Girl Scouts of Gateway Council's (GSGC) weekend event to celebrate the 100th Anniversary of Girl Scouting in the USA. The event will take place April 27-29 at North Fork Leadership Center in Middleburg.

What is there to do at Celebrate a Century?

During the day event Saturday (10:30am-5:30pm) there will be live entertainment at the main stage throughout the day. There will be four destinations to visit with activities for girls of all ages. The four destinations are:

- Girl Scouts Past, Present and Future
- GEMS (Girls in Engineering, Math and Science)
- Healthy Living
- Sports and Recreation

There will also be archery, low ropes, swimming and hiking on our newly built Dolly Day Trail.

There will be camping both Friday and Saturday nights. Girl Scout Daisies and Brownies may camp either Friday or Saturday night. Girl Scout Juniors, Cadettes, Seniors and Ambassadors may camp one or both nights. Activities are also planned for Friday and Saturday night. Friday night will include a campfire and sing-a-long. There will be various activities for girls Saturday night.

What is the cost of Celebrate a Century?

Saturday for the day only is \$12.00

Saturday plus one night of camping is \$14.00

Saturday plus both nights of camping is \$17.00

When can I register for Celebrate a Century?

Registration for Celebrate a Century will open January 17th. You can register by calling our registrar at 904.384.4475.

Who can attend Celebrate a Century?

Any Girl Scouts, their friends and families. Both troop and family camping will be permitted at the event. Anyone camping must be registered to camp by a GSGC Camp Trained adult. Leaders are encouraged to communicate with their Service Unit Manager or 100th Coordinator to register at the same time so you will be camping near each one another.

What are the food options for the event?

You may choose to cook your food or bring a picnic lunch. For those camping you may use propane stoves. No open fires will be permitted. There will also be the option to pre-purchase food from a vendor who will be onsite Friday and Saturday evenings.
