

Sister Program

Families with more than one Girl Scout selling cookies may qualify for the Sister Program.

- Sisters must sell a **combined average of 300 or more packages of cookies to qualify for cookie doughs.**
- Each sister will receive a patch and any cumulative incentives earned based on her individual sales in her troop.
- As sisters, **together**, they earn 15 cookie doughs for the first 300 packages sold and five (5) additional cookie doughs for each 50 additional packages sold. Sisters must sell a combined total of 300 or more packages to qualify for the Sister Program. *(An example of what is meant by "combined average" – one sister sells 100 packages and the second sister sells 250 packages for a total of 350 packages.(combined total). The total is then divided by 2 (the number of sisters) to get the "average". The combined average would be 175).*
- Sisters must sell a combined average of 175 packages in pre-sales to qualify for the Star Patch Pin.
- Sisters must sell a combined average of 600 packages to qualify for the 750+ Club and Event.
- Sisters must sell a combined average of 800 packages to qualify for the 1000+ Club.

Before selling cookies:

- 1) Fill out one sister program registration form for each sister. The Troop Cookie Activity Manager will fill out "Total packages sold _____" after all sales are finalized.
- 2) Return completed form to the Leader or Troop Cookie Activity Manager before the sale begins.

During the sale:

- 1) Keep a copy of your signed cookie pick-up receipts whenever you pick up cookies from either troop.
- 2) Have Troop Cookie Activity Manager sign a receipt for the number of cookies credited to your Girl Scout on the Cookie Booth Worksheets when she participates in a booth sale. Fill out "packages sold _____" portion of form when all sales have been finalized.

After the sale:

- 1) Each Troop Cookie Activity Manager will report the total amount sold by your daughter on this form.
- 2) Each of the Troop Cookie Activity Managers will report to you how many total cookies were sold by each of your girls to determine the cookie doughs earned. As a parent/guardian you can advise the Troop Cookie Activity Managers how you would like the cookie doughs distributed.
- 3) Each Troop Cookie Activity Manager will order the appropriate number of cookie doughs to be issued or the incentive(s) chosen instead of cookie doughs for the girl in her troop.
- 4) Each Troop Cookie Activity Manager will sign one of your cookie pick up receipts and note on the receipts the number of cookie doughs used or issued as well as the troop number.
- 5) Remember that these steps must be done with each troop.

Please note that you must decide how to divide up cookie doughs among your girls. If using all of your cookie doughs for one item, only one troop will place the order. Cookie Activity incentives are not available through the Council Shop. They must be ordered with the troop incentives. You may not use cookie doughs from a previous year to exchange for current year cookie activity incentives.
